# **SYLLABLES** in Words Their Way: Classroom

### What are the 6 main syllable types in the English language?

**Closed:** These syllables end in a consonant and the vowel is usually short. Examples include words like *hat, red, comet,* and *napkin*.

**Open:** These syllables end in one vowel and the vowel is generally long. Examples include words like *he, no, total,* and *motor.* 

**Vowel + Consonant + E (VCe):** These syllables have a long vowel and end with a silent e. Examples include words like *wake, lone, name, and pipe*.

**Vowel Teams:** These syllables are spelled with two vowels that are next to each other. Examples include words like *boat, suit, boil,* and *hay*.

**R-Influenced:** These syllables have a vowel followed by the letter r (*er, ir, ur, ar, or*). Examples include words like *far, bird, turn,* and *herd.* 

**Consonant + LE:** These syllables have a consonant followed by -le at the end of the word. Examples include words like *eagle*, *puzzle*, *ankle*, and *bubble*.

# Why is knowing these 6 syllable types critical for students learning to read?


Knowing the syllable and vowel grapheme types helps readers associate vowel spellings with vowel sounds. Syllable division rules help readers divide and decode unfamiliar words.

# How does *Words Their Way Classroom* help students practice the six syllable types of English?

The scope and sequence systematically addresses all 6 syllable types:

- The program begins with practice for CVC closed syllables in the Letter Name-Alphabetic Stage.
- CVCe, vowel teams, and r-influenced patterns are practiced in the Within Word Pattern Stage.
- Unaccented final syllable patterns (such consonant and le) are practiced in the Syllables and Affixes Stage.
- Other syllable patterns are practiced within the context of open and closed syllables.

### **PRACTICE ACTIVITIES** FOR THE SIX SYLLABLE TYPES from Words Their Way Classroom



#### Closed:

In this activity, students practice by identifying CVC words with the short e vowel sound.




#### Vowel + Consonant + E (VCe): In this digital writing sort, students practice by identifying if the word uses a CVC or VCe

syllable pattern.



#### Open:

In this digital sort, students practice by dragging the words to the correct short or long vowel pattern.




#### R-Influenced:

This digital activity provides practice in spelling words with r-influenced consonant patterns and reinforces word meaning.



#### **Vowel Teams:**

In this digital sort, students practice by dragging and dropping the words to the correct vowel team pattern.



#### Consonant + LE:

In this writing sort, students practice identifying the accented syllable in consonant + -le words.
